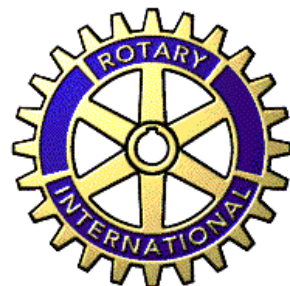

Their early intervention programs have a well-documented record of strengthening and improving parent-child relationships, working to prevent child abuse *before* it occurs.

Their goals are accomplished by matching families of at risk for child abuse, with professional social workers, and volunteer parent mentors who work with them in their homes. The goal of the intervention is to replace old patterns of abuse with nurturing parenting styles, as well as to empower parents to become financially self-sufficient.

Our Annual Golf Classic this year is set for Monday, October 25, 2004, at the Los Coyotes Country Club.

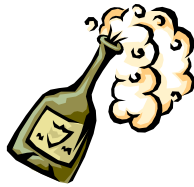
