Our program was provided by Richard Lyon, Rear Admiral, Seal, USNR (Ret.). Admiral Lyon has led a remarkable life—eventful, dramatic and patriotic. Admiral Lyon’s service in the Navy began as Seaman Recruit in 1942. Lyon rose through the chain of command first as a Regimental Commander, then as a Navy Scout and Raider and finally as a Scout Intelligence

Lyon was conducting recon on the beaches of the South Pacific in Mindanao when the atomic bombs were dropped on Japan... as a result, Lyon was one of the first Americans to step on Japanese soil after WWII. In 1951-52, Admiral Lyon served in the Korean War, in charge of de-mining Wonsan Harbor where the water temperature averaged 34 degrees! During the next 26 years, Admiral Lyon continued to serve our county in the Reserves, where he commanded seven Reserve units.... And did I mention that Admiral Lyon was President of our club in 1965???
