



The incredible way she puts everything together organizationally




President Vic Demands Respect

PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGE

Join us for next week's meeting, Sept 20, to participate in a silent ballot on amending our bylaws. The results will be determined by majority vote. The following is the proposed change to Article XI, which establishes the process for electing new members

ARTICLE XI—SECTION D

Current Language

(d) If no written objection to the proposal, stating reasons, is received by the Board from any member of the club within ten (10) days following publication of the name of the prospective member, the prospective member, upon payment of his admission fee, as prescribed in Article V of these bylaws, shall be considered to be elected to membership. If an objection has been filed with the Board, it shall consider the same at any regular or special meeting of the Board and shall ballot on the proposed member. If not to exceed zero negative votes are cast by the members of the Board in attendance at such regular or special meeting, the proposed member upon payment of the prescribed admissions fee, shall be considered to be elected to membership.

Proposed Change

(d) If no written objection to the proposal, stating reasons, is received by the Board from any member of the club within ten (10) days following publication of the name of the prospective member, the prospective member, upon payment of his admission fee, as prescribed in Article V of these bylaws, shall be considered to be elected to membership. If an objection has been filed with the Board, it shall consider the same at any regular or special meeting of the Board and shall ballot on the proposed member. If the members of the Board in attendance cast a majority of positive votes at such regular or special meeting, the proposed member upon payment of the prescribed admissions fee, shall be considered to be elected to membership.
